

This well-researched and vivid account, illustrated with black-and-white photographs, narrates the story of Peter Antonie's remarkable sporting career, which saw him represent his country from 1977 to 1996. In lightweight events, Antonie won one world championships gold medal, two silvers and a bronze, and a Commonwealth Games gold. He then switched to the 'open' sculling ranks in order to compete at the Olympic Games. Despite being at a considerable disadvantage in terms of both weight and height, he eventually contested three Olympics, and at the 1992 Games in Barcelona won a gold

medal when paired with Stephen Hawkins in the double sculls to secure his position as one of the greatest rowers and scullers Australia has ever produced. Antonie is also the only Australian thus far to have received the highest honour in rowing, the Thomas Keller Medal, awarded by the world body, FISA, 'to recognise an exceptional rowing career'.

Born in England, Robin Poke contested the Henley Royal Regatta as a coxswain before graduating to rowing, then migrated to Australia in 1969. He was a member of a successful lightweight squad at the Mosman club in Sydney, and twice manager of the NSW state squad. He founded a national magazine, *Australian Rowing*, and was manager of Australian teams at the 1978 and 1988 World Championships. Poke's long association with rowing provides him with a deep insight into the sport's history and traditions.
