## **Junior World Championship**

Following a spectacular opening ceremony fitting of the first test event for the Beijing Olympics, the 2007 World Rowing Junior Championships got underway at the Shunyi Rowing-Canoeing Park in Beijing, China. The opening ceremony featured a flow of dancers, acrobats, puppets with a mixture of traditional Chinese themes and a small element of western dance input. Today, the junior rowers got down to business to fight it out over 2000m. Weather conditions helped to create glass-like water with an ever-so-slight head wind picking up as the day continued.

The ACT rowers preformed well on day one of the Championships with Women's Pair of Christabelle Northam and Veronica Tamsitt finishing third in Heat 2 from Lane 5. The ACT pair got off to a great start just trailing the Bulgarians and narrowly ahead of the crew from Great Britain at the 500m mark. The Germans out of Lane 3 had made a slow start but started to come into their own by the half way mark edging the Australians out of second and set after the Bulgarians who had a strong lead. The Germans stormed home to beat the

Bulgarians with Northam and Tamsitt finishing a strong third.

**ACT Junior Men Zac** Cleaver and Nicholas Barnier teamed up with Queensland's Angus Morton and Tasmania's David Wright in the Junior Men's Quad had a extremely strong performance finishing second in their heat. The Aussie boys from Lane 6 had an extremely tuff task taking on event favourites Germany. The boys stayed on the heals of the Germans but after the 500m the Germany crew started to show their might. The Australians had then to fight off the Serbian crew who were pushing hard in third. The Aussie boys pulled away in the last 500m to take second a head of the Serbs and a strong finishing Swiss crew.



Day Two of the World junior Rowing Championships being another calm day provided excellent rowing conditions for the 500 rowers that have descended on Shunyi for the Championships.

ACT Junior Women's pair of Christabelle Northam and Veronica Tamsitt had the biggest challenge of the day taking on the might of host nation China who is favourites for this Event. The Chinese crew were all the more determined after being disqualified in the heats for an under weight boat. With the first two places going through to the finals it would become an important race for second place.

It was the Portuguese crew who got out to an early flyer with the Chinese crew in second and at the 500m mark the Canadians were just ahead of the Australian's in third. By the half way mark the Australian's had edged ahead of the Canadians with Portugal and China battling it out for the lead. The Chinese showed their supremacy taking the win and Portugal securing the second A Final spot. It was down to Australians and the Canadians for the one available spot in the B Final, With the Canadians taking the honours after

### ACTS Sport's Sports Star of the Month July

#### Sarah Cook and Kim Crow

Sarah Cook (ACT) and Kim Crow (VIC) were the standout Australian performers in the first two rounds of the Row-

ing World Cup., winning gold and bronze in the women's pairs. The pair caused a major upset when they gold at World

Cup 1 in Linz, Austria. Cook and Crow, 2007 Australian Champions, finished in a time of 7:09.39 ahead of the two fancied United States crews of Megan Cooke and Anna Mickelson, and the Susan Francia and Caroline Lind. The reigning World Champions from Canada, Darcy

Marquardt and Jane Rumball finished 4th. The Australian duo had a solid start to sit just behind the Canadians through the first 1000m before powering past the World Champions with 800m to go and holding off a strong finish from Cooke and Mickelson to win by half a boat length.

Looking to defend their win at World Cup 2 in Amsterdam Cook and Crow managed a bronze behind the Chinese and New Zealand pairs.

The Rowing World
Cup is a three round
series that is held
each year as a prelude to the world
championships or

Olympic Games. Entry is only open to national teams. In 2007 32 nations are competing in the three World Cup regattas.

### Sports Star of the Month — Masters Winners

#### John Struik and Kerry Knowler

#### **Master Rowers**

Both John and Kerry each won three gold, two silver and one bronze on their respective events at the Australian Masters Rowing Championships in Nagambie, Victoria.

John won gold in the Men's 70 years and over coxed four, the men's 65 and over coxless pair, and the men's 60 years and over coxed four. He also won silver in the men's 55 and over eight and pair. He won a bronze in the interstate men's eights.

39 year old Kerry won gold in the women's 36 and over double scull, and 27 and over quad scull and coxed four. She won silver in the women's 43 and over (average age) eight and 36 and over eight. She also won bronze in the women's C quad.

Rowing Victoria is rolling out Version 2 of ROMS for the 2007/2008 season very shortly.

ACT will be moving to the new ROMS a long with most other states for the new season as well.

Blow are some of the notes that were discussed at the Regatta Workshop.

It was suggested at the meeting that ACT Master there be No Handicapping. \*Better discrimination between C & D grades \*General consensus is that ROMS is Ok but we should investigate the possibility of using the NSW system

as it is more user friendly. Possibly cheaper as well, EO will investigate cost/benefit against ROMS.

- \*Schools and Non Schools should be separated in races where appropriate.
- \*It was suggested that C grade be 1000m races with a coxed quad option of 1500m
- \*It was suggested that D grade be 1000m

- \*The meeting agreed efforts should be made to have more eights racing.
- \*It was suggested there be more than 1 division – seeding for mixed Doubles and if sufficient in mixed masters.
- \*If enough school crews put in eights there should be schools only race.
