## World Masters Championships

30-plus countries competed at the 2007 World Rowing Masters Regatta in Zagreb, Croatia,

Canberra Rowing Club sent more than a dozen rowers to the championships. They included Preiner, Simson, Davoren, Brian, Bissaker, Humphries, Donoghoe, Daley, Strapps, Coles, Ningham, Hewitt, Whelan, & Moss

The strong CRC contingent provide some strong results (page 11) in the ultimate Master rowing competition in the world.

One of the more unique countries to make their debut at the World Masters Championships was the UAE. The United Arab Emirates



became members of the International Rowing Federa-

tion, FISA, just two years ago but in a short time they have built up an enthusiastic bunch of mainly ex-pat rowers, many of whom are over 27 years old, fitting into the masters category of rowing.

11 rowers traveled from Dubai in UAE to Lake Jarun in the heart of Croatia's capital, Zagreb.

Rowers had to deal with rain for the first two days of racing and a 65 year old rower was treated for hypothermia. But the water remained calm and fine for rowing.

The masters regatta attracts a range of talents with ex-Olympians rowing against first time racers.

Four thousand rowers competed for their local rowing

clubs, rather than countries. Many clubs also formed composite crews, especially

for the eights, with sometimes three different nations rowing together. The event's oldest rower, 88 year old regular racer, Charles Eugster rowed in a composite four made up of three different nations including top masters rowing nations – Germany, Italy and Great Britain.

The United States, as has become usual, boated a large number of crews from across the nation. One of the stalwarts of the sport, and regular racer, Ted Nash, made his annual trip to the world masters regatta. Nash, now 75, continues to coach at the national level and uses the masters regatta as a way of winding down at the end of the elite international season.

Chair of FISA's Masters Commission, Peter Morrison said it was quite a feat for the organising committee to run the 500+ races over the four days at three minute intervals.

"Racing started and finished on time each day," said Morrison. "A remarkable achievement considering the conditions sometimes and the inexperience of some of the crews."

A new ceremony this year was staged for all competitors over the age of 80. a medal for "The Ancient Order of OAR" (being Octogenarian Active Rower). *info from <http://www.veslanje.hr/wrmr2007/>*

## Col Panton Marathon — October 28th

The Col Panton Marathon is held annually to kick-off the ACTRA summer regatta season (October 28th). The event is named after rowers Colin (Leslie) Panton and his son Colin (Stuart) who tragically drowned in Lake Burley Griffin on 26 November 1964.

The marathon is a handicap

event for all boat classes, commencing at the Kingston Boat Harbour and finishing at the tree house in Weston Park - a distance of approximately 8 km.

## Reinhold Batschi Retires

.Reinhold joined the AIS in 1984 as Head Coach of the new Rowing program and had an immediate impact on lifting the performances of Australia's rowers. His training demands were legendary – I remember as a doctor working in the AIS Sports Medicine Department seeing rowers falling asleep in physio while being treated and telling stories of Reinhold picking up the weights in the gym and showing the young fit and strong rowers how much weight should be lifted! He became something of a legend.

Reinhold was Head Coach of Australian Rowing for many years (during the eighties) and during his reign of benevolent but firm rule as AIS Head Coach (1984-2000) Australia won 16 Olympic rowing medals (four gold, five silver and seven bronze)

and AIS rowers contributed 11 of these (three gold, four silver and four bronze). In 1986 the Australian Men's Eight won both the World Championships and Commonwealth Games gold medals.

Reinhold's pioneering work for rowing saw a national program for technique development instituted, a coach development program that was the forerunner of a national coach accreditation scheme, a program that ensured international competition for up and coming rowers, improved selection techniques for rowers and crews, and year round training!

Reinhold was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) in 1987 for his fantastic work for rowing.

Above all this Reinhold has been totally passionate about rowing, about the athletes he has coached and about devel-

oping other coaches. His passion has brought him into vigorous discussion with colleagues at times but there has never been any doubt about Reinhold's integrity or commitment to success. His unwavering expectation of commitment and diligence has been a hallmark of his time with us.

Reinhold is looking forward to some time off with his wife and family and this is well deserved. The AIS will not be letting him go just like that of course and I intend to ask Reinhold to come back from time to time and share his experience and wisdom with us. He is a national asset, an icon and all round good guy (and no, Reinhold did not write this bit for me). Well done, Reiny, and thanks from all of us.

A list identifying the makes and model of boats in the specified boat class will be provided for Bulletin 1 of the 2008 National Rowing Championships. Please find below a brief description of the different categories of athletes.  
For an athlete to compete at the 2008 National Rowing Championships they must be classified by a National Classification Panel. An opportunity for athletes to be classified will be provided at the 2008 National Rowing Championships prior to racing.  
The Classification Nomination process and Classification Guidelines will be published following the Rowing Australia Board's approval at the end of September.

**ELIGIBILITY AND CLASSIFICATION**  
**A. LTA (Legs, Trunk**

**and arms)**

The LTA class is for rowers with a disability who have the use of their legs, trunk and arms and who can utilize the sliding seat. LTA rowers must meet minimum disability requirements in at least one of the following three disability groups:  
(1) Intellectual disability  
A rower must meet the eligibility criteria established by the Australian Sport and Recreation Association for Persons with Integration Difficulties Inc. (AUSRAPID) and have completed the athlete eligibility application using the May 2004 Athlete Application for Registration Package and subsequently issued with an AUSRAPID Registration Card. (The AUSRAPID Registration Package can be found on the AUSRAPID Website [www.ausrapid.org.au/ContentPages/home.htm](http://www.ausrapid.org.au/ContentPages/home.htm)) Athletes classified under criteria prior to May 2004 must be re-registered with AUSRAPID using the May 2004 Athlete Application for Registration Package.  
(2) Visual Impairment  
A rower must have been classified by an ophthalmologist or the

## Lord's Taverners Australia, Scholarship

The Lord's Taverners Australia, ACT Branch Scholarship Scheme for young aspiring athletes with a disability provides funding to such athletes who are residents of the ACT and its region who are registered with an ACT sporting organisation. It is designed to help them achieve their long term sporting goals.

A total funding of \$5000 will be available annually over the next three years. The number and value of individual scholarships will depend on the number and cost of proposals but the scheme will be flexibly managed to maximize participation.

The scholarship period is 12 months, from 1 January to 31 December 2008. The timeline for the election process is outlined below:

Closing date for applications  
**Friday 16 November**

Who is eligible for assistance?

Scholarships are available for athletes who are currently residents of the Australian Capital Territory and its region who have a disability and are registered with an ACT Sporting Organisation.

All disabilities are eligible for assistance

Athletes must be in the age group 12 – 20 years

The following selection criteria will be used to assess each application on relative merit. Please note that the criteria should not be viewed in isolation, as **all** selection guidelines will be considered.

If you are currently competing in sporting events. You must have clear

achievement goals for the next year.

If you are not currently competing in sporting events. You must have clear competition plans for the next year

If you are receiving current funding assistance to participate in sport. You must be prepared to provide all details

## Adaptive Classifications continued...

International Blind Sports Federation (IBSA) in one of the B3, B2 or B1 classes. For a description of these classes please refer to [www.ibsa.es](http://www.ibsa.es) The *FISA Adaptive Rowing Vision Qualification Form* should be completed by an Ophthalmologist or Optometrist, and submitted along with the *Classification Forms* and supporting documentation to RA prior to classification.

(3) Physical Disability  
The minimum physical is

the loss of ten points on one limb or fifteen points across two limbs when assessed using the *Functional Classification test* (outlined in the FISA Classification Guidelines), a full loss of three fingers on one hand, or at least a tarsal metatarsal amputation of the foot.

**B. TA (Trunk and Arms)**  
The TA class is for rowers who have trunk movement and who are unable to use the sliding seat to propel the boat because

of significantly weakened function of the lower limbs.

### **C. A (Arms Only)**

The A class is for rowers who have no or minimal trunk function (i.e. shoulder function only). An

A class rower is able to apply force predominantly using the arms and/or shoulders.

Note: Athletes may move up in class for competition without affecting their sport class status, but

may not move down. For example, an athlete classified as TA may row as LTA, but not as A.
