Sarah Cook win's medals in the US

Canberra rower Sarah Cook was just one of a number of Australian crew that headed to the US for the World Rowing Challenge.

Following the rigours of the recent World Championships in Munich, nine Australian rowers were invited to compete at the USA World Rowing Challenge, which was run in association with the Oklahoma Head of the River.

The Australian Women's Eight headed over the Atlantic, along with Peter Hardcastle, fresh off his success of qualifying the Men's Single Scull for the Beijing Olympic Games next year.

The regatta provided a variety of racing and this was witnessed on the Friday night as a number of 500 metre races were held under lights. Sally Kehoe and Peter Hardcastle both showed their explosive sculling abilities as they won the Women's and Men's Single Scull. In the 500 metre

Women's Pair event Australia entered three crews with Sarah Heard and Vicky Roberts finishing second, Sarah Cook and Kim Crow third, and Sally Kehoe and Kate Hornsey fourth.

The women's squad faced an exceptionally hard weekend of rowing as they not only

Saturday night featured some great racing as Sally Kehoe and Peter Hardcastle both gained bronze medals in the 2000m Single Sculls,

NCA Close Lake due to Sewerage Spill

The ACT Health Protection Service has advised the NCA that the entire Lake Burley Griffin be closed to primary contact recreation such as swimming and secondary contact recreation such as boating as results from water tests have indicated unacceptable levels of bacteria.

The NCA was advised by the ACT Department of Territory & Municipal

Services (Environment & Recreation) yesterday of a sewer leak in Queanbeyan that had flowed into the Molonglo River. East Basin was closed as a precautionary measure, the NCA has since tested the water and closed the entire lake to swimming and boating.

The NCA will continue to closely monitor water quality and the lake will remain closed until bacteria levels return to normal.

Lake user groups have been notified of the closure and warning signs will be posted around the lake.

Commercial ferry operators are exempt from this closure, however, are advised that passengers should avoid contact with lake water.

The Captain Cook Memorial Jet will not operate until water quality levels return to normal.

During the year the Associa-

Officer and a superior venue for Committee meetings.

National Elite Development Program

On 12 March 2007 Rowing Australia released documentation for the National Elite Development

Program (NEDP). Under this program, funding is provided to each State for the identifica-

tion, recruitment, development and management of talented rowing athletes for Junior (U19) and U23

World Championship competition. The Program replaces the Elite Development Funding and

Elite Club Funding Programs that have operated across Australia from 2005. The program will be

overseen through the Joint

Management Committee process in each State.

The aim of the NEDP is to support the State Rowing Organisations and Academies of Sport to implement jointly agreed strategies to recruit talented athletes and prepare, develop and manage

them for selection and competition in the Junior and U23 World Championships. These strategies will be as identified in the Elite Athlete Development Pathway document in each state.

Specifically the NEDP provides a contribution to full time salaries to:

- recruit and develop talented U19 athletes and the coaches of junior athletes into pathway programs in each state.

Elite Program Manager

Rowing Australia would like to welcome back Matt Draper who has returned to the organisation to fill the recently vacated position of Elite Program Manager. He commenced his new role on Monday 15 October.

Matt has previously worked with Rowing Australia as the High Performance Manager in 1995 – 1999.

In the interim, Matt has held a number of significant sporting positions. He worked for SOCOG in the lead up to the Sydney Olympic Games, as well as

holding various senior positions overseas with the Grasshopper Club Zürich, ATHOC Olympic Games Organising Committee, the Qatar Asian Games and most recently for FISA - as Events and Development Consultant.

The experience that Matt will bring to Rowing Australia in the lead up to the 2008 Beijing Olympics will be invaluable.

High Performance Administrator

The ACT Rowing Association along with its High Performance Partners ACT Academy of Sport (ACTAS) and Rowing Australia is pleased to announce James Macartney as the ACT Elite Development Co-Ordinator.

James moved to Canberra last year from the UK where he had good success in coaching Junior Athletes in the British based rowing system. James's Coaching was predominately through the Oxford Brooks and Thames rowing Clubs and his athletes have had success at Under 23 world championship level.

The Elite Development Co-Ordinator will have a diverse role with very specific targets in terms of meeting athletes to Rowing Australia's EDP standards. With the majority of these athletes expected to come from ACT Rowing Clubs High Performance pathways.

The EDP Co-ordinator will have a close relationship with Clubs and Schools and will make regular appearances at clubs to assist with the development of the high performance pathway.

The EDP role will also have a large component of his time directed towards Talent Identification. This will come

from within the rowing system and from outside.

Currently RA are working on national standards for the NEDP program currently headed up by RA new High Performance Manager Matt Draper.

A set of standard testing regimes will be announced shortly of which the NEDP co-ordinator will outline to your club.

James is a familiar face in ACT rowing and has been coaching for ANU who won this years Disher Cup and came 4th at Uni games. James also coached the Men's ACT Squad for 2007 Youth Cup.
